b mma Bell Miles was a writer, painter and naturalist who lived at the turn of the 20th century in the Chattanooga area.

She is widely recognized as a pioneering ethnographer of Southern Appalachian culture. Her books, which she also illustrated, include The Spirit of the Mountains, Strains from a Dulcimore and Our Southern Birds.

The symposium honors her prose, poems, journals, letters, and paintings, while examining them in a broader context. Enjoy:
